  Though the earth be shaking, every heart be quaking,
  Jesus calms my fear.
  Fires may flash and thunder crash; yea, though sin and hell assail me,
  Jesus will not fail me.
- 3. Banish thoughts of sadness, for the Lord of gladness, Jesus, enters in; though the clouds may gather, those who love the Saviour still have peace within. Though I bear much sorrow here, still in you lies purest pleasure, Jesus, priceless treasure!


The Creed 'Wir glauben all in einen Gott' from Görlitzer Tabulaturbuch
